Dear Mr. Dole:

I would like to express my views concerning the situation in Viet Nam.

I feel confident that if some foreign power were to draw a boundary through Kansas at the 38th parallel and proceed to consider those north of the boundary as North Kansans and those south of the boundary as South Kansans - we would not feel too happy with matters.

Consider some foreign government installing a puppet regime in South Kansas and supplying that puppet with military "advisors" plus billions of dollars in armaments. Consider the South Kansas army destroying South Kansas cities, farms, and people.

Mr. Dole, the preceding might sound rather "far fetched", but in fact that is exactly what has happened in Viet Nam. In 1954 the U.S. tentatively approved elections in Viet Nam. It seems that only because "our man" could not win, we have done all in our power to prevent an election in that country.

Surely the people of Kansas want to have the privilege to decide their own destiny. Surely we should be honest enough to extend such privileges to others.

I hope you will add your voice to those of the few brave voices in the Congress to bring about withdrawal of U.S. forces from Viet Nam.
