
Dear ██████████:

Thank you for your recent letter regarding the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). I appreciate hearing from you on this important matter.

Most economists agree that it is still early in the implementation of NAFTA to measure the effects on the U.S. economy. However, with NAFTA having been in effect for over eighteen months, several studies have concluded that exports to Mexico did increase in 1994, thus creating American jobs. While the devaluation of the peso has negatively affected recent trade balance numbers with Mexico, the apparent stabilization of the peso should help improve the trade picture. You may be certain that I will continue to monitor trade as a result of NAFTA and the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) to ensure that U.S. manufacturers and farmers are given the opportunity to compete on a level playing field.
