Dear Senator:


As you well know by now, the AFL-CIO strongly opposes the North American Free Trade Agreement as a bad deal for America.

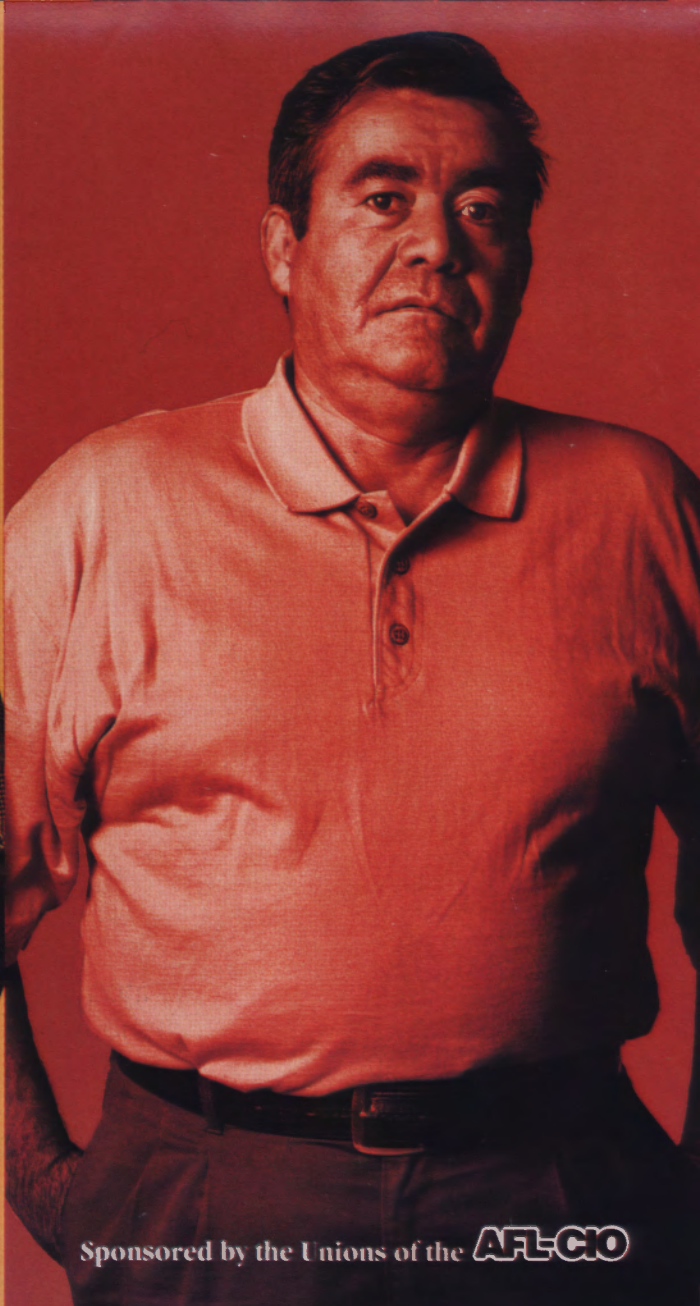
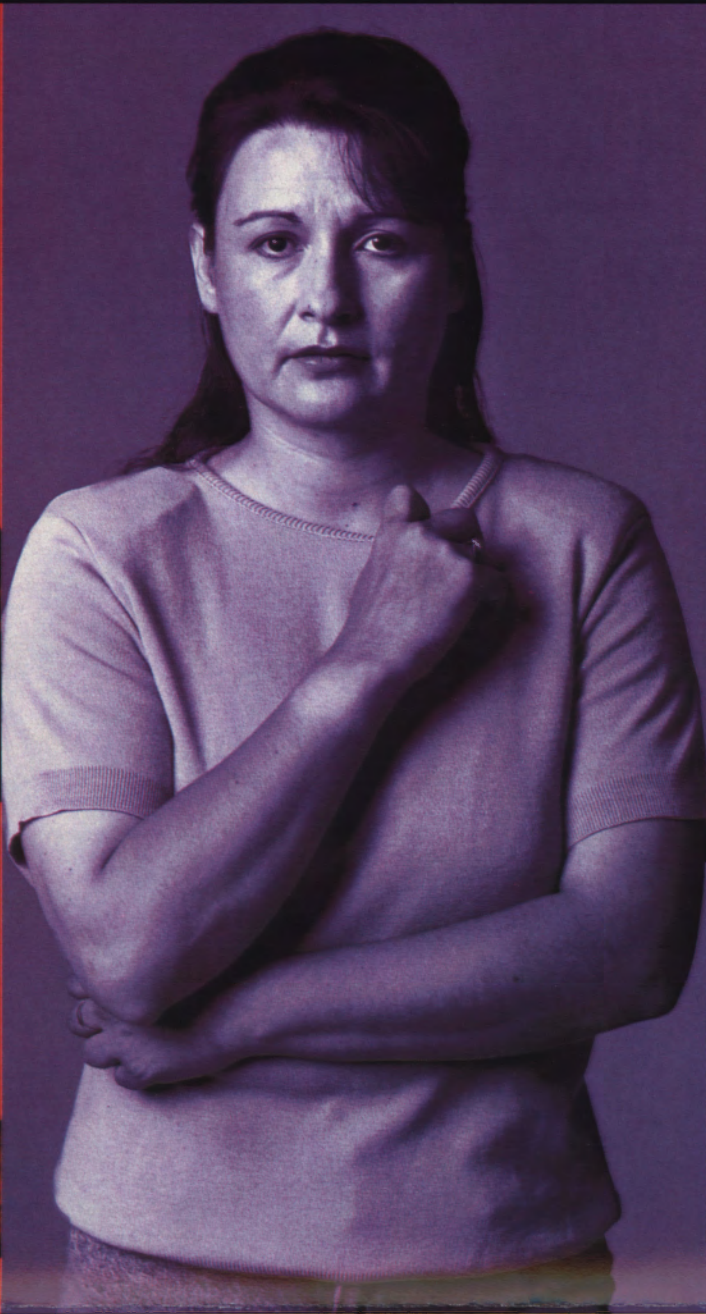
