CHINA MOST-FAVORED-NATION STATUS/Final Passage

SUBJECT: Conditional Most-Favored-Nation Trade Status for China Act . . . H.R. 2212. Final Passage

ACTION: BILL PASSED, 55-44

SYNOPSIS: A pertinent vote on this legislation includes No. 141.
As amended, H.R. 2212 will require China to meet specified conditions before to recommend the continuation of a waiver in 1992 for a 12-month period under subsection(d) of s Trade Act of 1974 for the People's Republic of China, allowing the continuation of most-favored-n for China. Specifically, the conditions that will have to be met are as follows:

- in regard to the violent repression of dissent in Tiananmen Square on June 3, 1989, China must accounting of citizens who were detained, accused, or sentenced for their nonviolent political exp have released any citizens imprisoned for political expression;
- progress must have been made by China in preventing human rights violations, ending relig removing restrictions on Voice of America broadcasts, terminating harassment of Chinese national States, ensuring access of international human rights groups to prisoners, trials, and places o terminating prohibitions on peaceful assembly and demonstrations;
- the Joint Declaration on Hong Kong must be adhered to by China;
- China must not support or administer any program of coercive abortion or involuntary sterilizatio
- Assurances must be given by China to the United States that China will not assist a nonnuclear any way that may help such a State acquire nuclear weapons, and the United States must certify the such assurances;
- assurances must be given by China to the United States that China will not contribute to the missiles, specifically in the Middle East and South Asia;
- the exportation of products made by forced-labor must be discontinued, and the United S organizations must be allowed to inspect detention centers to verify compliance; and
- China must have moderated its position regarding Taiwan's access to the General Agreement Trade.
