Thank you for your letter and newspaper clipping concerning the exodus of Cuban nationals to our country.

I have contacted the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee to obtain information, and was advised a report is to be compiled in the near future setting forth the conclusions of committee investigators who have gone to Florida to check into various aspects of this emigration. The staff director indicated that it is doubtful there are many professional people among those now reaching Florida, and that a large percentage are persons dependent on others for support. I was told also that \$100 per month is provided to each of these persons plus spuplus commodities such as those distributed to welfare recipients. This influx of thousands of people is said to be creating serious problems to cities such as Miami which has not be able to cope with the problem created by the thousands reaching this country more than five years ago.

Do continue to give me the benefit of your views on important issues, and when I may be of assistance, do not hesitate to let me know.
